#### Naval News March 2021 Navy Forces Maritime Defense Industry

United States approves the sale of five P-8A Naval Patrol Aircraft to Germany

The Government of Germany has requested to buy five (5) P-8A Patrol Aircraft; nine (9) Multifunctional Distribution System Joint Tactical Radio Systems 5 (MIDS JTRS 5); and twelve (12) LN-251 with Embedded Global Positioning Systems (GPS)/ Inertial Navigations Systems (INS).

The contract also includes commercial engines; Tactical Open Mission Software (TOMS); Electro-Optical (EO) and Infrared MX-20HD; AN/ AAQ-2(V) I Acoustic System; AN/APY-10 radar; ALQ-240 Electronic Support Measures; NexGen Missile Warning Sensors; AN/PRC-117G Manpack radios include MPE-S type II with SAASM 3.7; Global Positioning Systems (GPS) 524D Precise Positioning System (PPS) for APY-10 Radar; AN/ALQ-213 Electronic Counter Measures; AN/ALE-47 Counter Measures Dispensing Systems; AN/UPX IFF Interrogators; APX- I 23A(C) IFF Digital Transponders; KIV-78 IFF Mode 5 Cryptographic Appliques; CCM-701A Cryptographic Core Modules; KY-100M, KY-58, KYV-5 for HF-121C radios; AN/ PYQ-10 V3 Simple Key Loaders (SKL) with KOY-21 Cryptographic Appliques; aircraft spares; spare engine; support equipment; operational support systems; training; training devices; maintenance trainer/classrooms; publications; software; engineering technical assistance (ETA); logistics technical assistance (LTA); Country Liaison Officer (CLO) support; Contractor Engineering Technical Services (CETS); repair and return (RoR); transportation; aircraft ferry; and other associated training and support; and other related elements of logistics and program support.

The Boeing P-8A Poseidon is an American-made maritime patrol aircraft developed and produced by Boeing Defense based on a modified civilian aircraft 737-800ERX bringing together a reliable airframe and high-bypass turbofan jet engine with a fully connected, state-of-the-art open architecture mission system. Boeing was awarded the contract to develop the P-8A on June 14, 2004. The P-8 is deployed in two variants including the P-81, in service with the Indian Navy, and the P-8A Poseidon used by the U.S. Navy, the Royal Australian Air Force, and the United Kingdom's Royal Air Force. The P-8A operates in anti-submarine warfare (ASW), anti-surface warfare (ASUW), and shipping interdiction roles. It is armed with torpedoes, Harpoon anti-ship missiles, and other weapons, can drop and monitor sonobuoys, and can operate in conjunction with other assets, including the Northrop GrummanMQ-4CTriton maritime surveillance unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV). The P-8 Poseidon has a crew of two and five operators including two naval flight officers plus three enlisted Aviation Warfare Operators/naval aircrewman. The P-8 can fly higher (up to 41,000 ft - 12,496 m) and get to the fight faster (490 knots - 907 km/h). (Editor Note: This article is letter for letter just as in the magazine.)

The city's Garden of the Gods Park features iconic red-sandstone formations and mountain views. It is also home to venerable Air Force Academy. Get out of the late summer heat and join us for what is sure to be a terrific time in cool Colorado Springs.



#### **Hotel Information**

We will be staying at the newly renovated, and refreshed, **Embassy Suites** located at 7290 Commerce Center Drive, Colorado Springs, CO 80919. The hotel room rate is just **\$139** plus tax per night. The room rate <u>includes a hot breakfast buffet</u>, served daily and 2 free drinks nightly, during reunion dates.



For those of you who choose to arrive early or stay late, the same room rate is available three days prior and three days after, <u>based on availability</u>. Make your hotel reservations NOW to insure the best availability. You may cancel without penalty up to 72 hours in advance.

The most reliable way to make hotel reservation is to type this link into your browser: https://tinyurl.com/4zw8fd5t

Enter your travel dates and follow the prompts. The second-best way to make a reservation is to call the hotel at (719) 599-9100 and **press** "0" to reach the front desk. For best results, try to assure you are speaking with the front desk of the hotel and not some central reservations office in Manila, by pressing "0". Always request the VQ Association group rate of \$139/night. All rooms are Suites. Mountain View Rooms are an extra \$40/night. Reservations are due by August 6<sup>th</sup>.

#### Airport Transportation & Parking

Colorado Springs (COS) is the closest to the hotel. You may also consider Denver which is a little further away. You will need to make arrangements for a ride to the hotel, from either airport. Uber is probably your best bet. For those of you driving, the hotel offers plenty of free parking. If you need specific directions call the hotel's front desk (719) 599-9100 for assistance.


clean bunkhouse humor have delighted over seven million people from around the world.
